



REFLECTION



“God So Loved The World That He Gave His Only Son”

As we contemplate and celebrate the Trinity today, we also consider all the dimensions and expressions of love it reveals. No greater love story has ever been told than the one that Jesus shared with Nicodemus: “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.” Today’s Gospel affirms that God’s motivation for desiring to be engaged with us is love. As is reflected in salvation history love characterized all of God’s overtures and interactions with human beings. When God chose Israel to be integral to the divine plan, the reason was love. It was this unconditional love that became flesh in Jesus and dwelt among us. This love of God offers us a daily reason for celebration. As recipients of this great celebratory love, we bring condemnation upon ourselves if we do not respond to this love of God. Faith is the only appropriate response – a lived faith that is translated into a deliberate decision to love God and to love others as an expression of our love for God.

The Most Holy Trinity

After the glories of the Easter Season, the Church leads us back into Ordinary Time by gentle degrees. Before the Sundays return to green vestments, we celebrate two wonderful solemnities: the Most Holy Trinity and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The timing of these solemnities is significant, at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came in transforming power upon the disciples, and the life of faith that we know, began. Today’s celebration, the Most Holy Trinity dates to the Seventh Century. It has been on the Church’s universal calendar for nearly seven hundred years. The mystery of the Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. The history of salvation is the history of how God gradually reveals himself to humanity as the one true God.
