REFLECTION

I Cannot Come

As incredible as it may seem, some people turn down the invitation. They either ignore it completely or become so involved in their own concerns they have no time for it. Other people actually attack those who have been sent to deliver the invitation. This is the case not only in the parable but also in our world today. An invitation to the eschatological banquet does not seem to be as interesting as a sports event, the latest movie, or some social affair. So much of our time and energy is spent either climbing the economic ladder or just trying to keep our heads above water. It is not that the concerns of our lives are ignoble; they are not. But even if we are interested in the banquet, we do not seem able to afford the time and energy it might require. And so we send our regrets: I cannot come.

What a shame! We seem to have forgotten that everything is tending toward the end; life itself is moving toward the time of the banquet. All of our plans, all of our interests, all of our distractions will cease. Only the banquet will remain, and we will have turned down our invitation.

ORDINARY TIME - LOOKING AHEAD

The Twenty-ninth and Thirtieth Sundays

The Gospels of the Twenty-ninth and Thirtieth Sundays proclaim serious lessons that Jesus taught, not in the form of parables but within the framework of harsh confrontations with scribes and Pharisees. These teachings show in full light what characterizes the gospel and the life lived according to it, in opposition to die-hard religious conceptions and practices that to the present day threaten to distort Christian behavior into a caricature. "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" (Matt 22:15-21 – Twenty-ninth Sunday). "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" (Matt 22:34-40 – Thirtieth Sunday). These are genuine questions that must be asked. But in what spirit are they asked? Is it with a sincere heart and in order to conduct oneself according to the gospel, or is it to find loopholes through which to escape its exigencies?
